   Motion passed unanimously.
- Motion was made by Barry Boothe seconded by Gilbert Philippus to adopt the 2022-23 budget of one million dollars. Motion passed unanimously.
- Motion was made by Brian Schauer seconded by Barry Boothe to move that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of 0.0223 which is effectively a 4.69 percent increase in the tax rate for maintenance and operations. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote from all Commissioners.
- There was discussion only with all commissioners, Keith Schmidt, and fire chiefs at the meeting on the
  county Fire Marshalls position. Keith advised that it would cost approximately five hundred dollars each to
  train more fire investigators and would advise on how many we would be training. Keith advised he would
  continue serving the county as the County Fire Marshall.
- Jason Whiddon made the motion seconded by Barry Boothe to pay any outstanding invoices for the ESD.
   Motion passes unanimously.
- With no further business, Barry Boothe made the motion seconded by Brian Schauer to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed unanimously.
